MATHEMATICS

Multiplication & Division, Fractions & 2D/3D Shapes

- Practice your times tables focus on x2, x5 and x 10
- Create a page full of numbers, different sizes and different colours, but make sure they are the correct way round.
- Create your own multiplication sums using equal groups of objects from inside and outside your house.
- Count in 10s past 100.
- Set up a shop at home – sell items to your family.
- Create a picture using only shapes.
- Look around you, take pictures of the shapes you can see.
- Create a poster about addition/subtraction/multiplication/division.
- Think of an even number, share it into equal groups.
- Create a poster about fractions - $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{2}{3}$, $\frac{3}{4}$.
